The next three appendixes are primarily dedicated to dating the Book of Daniel. Leveraging the breakthrough of Illuminating the Narrow Gate's paradigm shift, Appendix D ("Redirecting the Debate About Daniel") decimates the prevailing scholarly conclusion that Daniel's prophecies were a hoax written in the 2nd century BCE.
