HOW TO USE FAIRY TALES AND NURSERY RHYMES EFFECTIVELY

KNOWING THE STORIES AND RHYMES IS ONLY THE BEGINNING. THE WAY YOU PRESENT THESE TIMELESS PIECES CAN DEEPLY IMPACT A CHILD’S ENGAGEMENT AND LEARNING.

TIPS FOR STORYTELLING AND SINGING

- **MAKE IT INTERACTIVE:** USE PUPPETS, PROPS, OR COSTUMES TO BRING FAIRY TALES TO LIFE. ENCOURAGE CHILDREN TO ACT OUT PARTS OR PREDICT WHAT HAPPENS NEXT.
- **INCORPORATE QUESTIONS:** ASK OPEN-ENDED QUESTIONS DURING AND AFTER STORYTELLING TO STIMULATE THINKING AND COMPREHENSION.
- **USE RHYTHMIC MOVEMENTS:** PAIR NURSERY RHYMES WITH HAND GESTURES OR DANCE MOVES TO ENHANCE MEMORY THROUGH PHYSICAL ACTIVITY.
- **ADAPT TO AGE AND INTERESTS:** SIMPLIFY OR ELABORATE ON STORIES DEPENDING ON THE CHILD'S AGE AND ATTENTION SPAN.
