The Science Behind How Tornadoes Form for Kids

Warm Air Meets Cold Air

ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT PARTS OF HOW TORNADOES FORM FOR KIDS IS UNDERSTANDING HOW WARM AND COLD AIR INTERACT. TORNADOES USUALLY START WHEN WARM, MOIST AIR FROM THE GROUND RISES UP AND MEETS COOLER, DRIER AIR HIGHER IN THE SKY. THIS CREATES A STORM BECAUSE WARM AIR IS LIGHTER AND WANTS TO RISE, WHILE COLD AIR IS HEAVIER AND SINKS.

WHEN THESE TWO DIFFERENT AIR MASSES COLLIDE, IT CAUSES THE AIR TO BECOME UNSTABLE. THIS INSTABILITY IS LIKE A RECIPE FOR A THUNDERSTORM, THE KIND OF STORM THAT CAN PRODUCE TORNADOES.

Wind Shear: The Spinning Secret

ANOTHER KEY PIECE IN THE PUZZLE OF HOW TORNADOES FORM FOR KIDS IS SOMETHING CALLED WIND SHEAR. WIND SHEAR HAPPENS WHEN WINDS AT DIFFERENT HEIGHTS BLOW IN DIFFERENT DIRECTIONS OR AT DIFFERENT SPEEDS. THIS CAUSES THE AIR TO START SPINNING HORIZONTALLY, LIKE A ROLLING PIN ROLLING ON A TABLE.

IMAGINE ROLLING A PENCIL ACROSS A TABLE—THIS IS SIMILAR TO WHAT THE WIND IS DOING HIGH IN THE SKY. THIS SPINNING AIR DOESN'T START AS A TORNADO YET; IT'S LIKE THE AIR IS ROLLING SIDEWAYS.

Turning the Spin Vertical

HERE'S WHERE THE MAGIC REALLY HAPPENS IN HOW TORNADOES FORM FOR KIDS! WHEN A STRONG THUNDERSTORM DEVELOPS, THE RISING WARM AIR PULLS THAT SPINNING HORIZONTAL AIR UPWARDS. AS THE SPINNING AIR TURNS FROM HORIZONTAL TO VERTICAL, IT STARTS TO STRETCH AND SPIN FASTER—JUST LIKE WHEN YOU PULL IN YOUR ARMS WHILE SPINNING TO GO FASTER ON A MERRY-GO-ROUND.

THIS SPINNING COLUMN OF AIR IS CALLED A MESOCYCLONE, AND IT'S THE BEGINNING OF A TORNADO.

HOW DOES A TORNADO GROW AND TOUCH THE GROUND?

FROM MESOCYCLONE TO FUNNEL CLOUD

THE SPINNING AIR INSIDE THE STORM GETS STRONGER AND STRONGER. THE CLOUDS ABOVE START TO STRETCH DOWNWARDS TOWARD THE GROUND, CREATING WHAT LOOKS LIKE A FUNNEL—THIS IS CALLED A FUNNEL CLOUD. NOT ALL FUNNEL CLOUDS BECOME TORNADOES, BUT WHEN ONE TOUCHES THE GROUND, IT OFFICIALLY BECOMES A TORNADO.

WHY DOES THE FUNNEL REACH THE GROUND?

THE FUNNEL CLOUD REACHES THE GROUND BECAUSE OF THE PRESSURE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE AIR INSIDE THE STORM AND THE AIR OUTSIDE. THE LOW PRESSURE INSIDE THE FUNNEL CAUSES THE AIR TO RUSH IN AND SPIN FASTER AND FASTER. WHEN THE SPINNING AIR CONNECTS THE CLOUD TO THE GROUND, IT PICKS UP DUST, DIRT, AND DEBRIS, MAKING THE TORNADO VISIBLE.

4. **STAY CALM AND WAIT UNTIL IT'S SAFE.** TORNADOES USUALLY PASS QUICKLY, BUT IT'S IMPORTANT TO STAY INSIDE

UNTIL YOU HEAR IT'S OKAY TO COME OUT.

3. WIND SHEAR: CHANGING WINDS WITH HEIGHT

WIND SHEAR REFERS TO HOW WIND DIRECTION OR SPEED CHANGES AT DIFFERENT HEIGHTS IN THE ATMOSPHERE. FOR TORNADOES TO FORM, WINDS NEAR THE GROUND MIGHT BLOW IN ONE DIRECTION, WHILE WINDS HIGHER UP BLOW IN ANOTHER. THIS DIFFERENCE CAN CAUSE THE AIR TO START SPINNING HORIZONTALLY, LIKE A ROLLING PIN.

4. A TRIGGER TO LIFT THE AIR

SOMETHING HAS TO PUSH THE WARM, MOIST AIR UPWARD TO BEGIN THE THUNDERSTORM PROCESS. THIS TRIGGER CAN BE A COLD FRONT, A MOUNTAIN, OR EVEN THE UNEVEN HEATING OF THE GROUND. ONCE THE AIR STARTS TO RISE, THE SPINNING CAUSED BY WIND SHEAR CAN TILT THIS HORIZONTAL ROTATION INTO A VERTICAL POSITION.

HOW TORNADOES DEVELOP FROM THUNDERSTORMS

TORNADO FORMATION IS CLOSELY LINKED TO THUNDERSTORMS, ESPECIALLY A SPECIAL TYPE CALLED SUPERCELLS. SUPERCELLS ARE POWERFUL STORMS WITH A ROTATING UPDRAFT CALLED A MESOCYCLONE. HERE'S HOW THE PROCESS UNFOLDS:

STAGE 1: FORMATION OF A THUNDERSTORM

AS WARM, MOIST AIR RISES, IT COOLS AND CONDENSES INTO WATER DROPLETS, FORMING CLOUDS. THIS RISING AIR CREATES A THUNDERSTORM WITH STRONG UPDRAFTS (AIR MOVING UPWARD) AND DOWNDRAFTS (AIR MOVING DOWNWARD).

STAGE 2: DEVELOPING ROTATION

WIND SHEAR CAUSES THE AIR NEAR THE SURFACE TO SPIN HORIZONTALLY. WHEN THIS SPINNING AIR IS LIFTED BY THE THUNDERSTORM'S UPDRAFT, IT TILTS VERTICAL, CREATING A ROTATING COLUMN OF AIR INSIDE THE STORM—THE MESOCYCLONE.

STAGE 3: TORNADO FORMATION

IF THE ROTATING COLUMN OF AIR BECOMES STRONG AND TIGHT ENOUGH, IT EXTENDS DOWNWARD FROM THE CLOUD TOWARD THE GROUND. WHEN IT TOUCHES THE GROUND, IT BECOMES A TORNADO. THIS FUNNEL CLOUD CAN THEN GROW OR SHRINK DEPENDING ON ATMOSPHERIC CONDITIONS.

STAGE 4: DISSIPATION

EVENTUALLY, THE TORNADO LOSES STRENGTH AS THE STORM'S ENERGY DECREASES OR THE ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS CHANGE. THE FUNNEL LIFTS BACK INTO THE CLOUD AND DISAPPEARS.

WHY DO TORNADOES MOSTLY HAPPEN IN “TORNADO ALLEY”?

IN THE UNITED STATES, A REGION CALLED TORNADO ALLEY—COVERING PARTS OF TEXAS, OKLAHOMA, KANSAS, AND NEBRASKA—EXPERIENCES MORE TORNADOES THAN ANYWHERE ELSE. THIS HAPPENS BECAUSE THIS AREA OFTEN FEATURES THE PERFECT MIX OF WARM, MOIST AIR FROM THE GULF OF MEXICO AND COLD, DRY AIR FROM CANADA AND THE ROCKY MOUNTAINS. THE GEOGRAPHY AND CLIMATE SET THE STAGE FOR THE POWERFUL THUNDERSTORMS THAT CAN SPAWN TORNADOES.

FEATURES AND VARIATIONS OF TORNADOES
