Un aspetto affascinante e assai meno esplorato di Crowley riguarda il suo rapporto con la letteratura, come scrittore ma soprattutto come personaggio. Le sue apparizioni da un lato sfidano la letteratura alta, da Somerset Maugham a Pessoa, da Hemingway a Sciascia e Consolo; dall'altro persino nelle opere popolari si aprono a questioni di ampio interesse, sia nei rapporti con altri letterati di fama (Yeats, Isherwood...) sia verso cerchie culturali e artistiche di svariatissimo genere. A monte di questa pletora di apparizioni

troviamo alcune opere curiose, quasi variazioni su un unico mito, che fungeranno da filo rosso per gli itinerari qui proposti. Storie dove la Bestia incontra la Bella e dov'è trasposta in forma narrativa la complessa dialettica sul "femminile", sospesa tra le teorie di Crowley e la sua prassi di magnetico sciupafemmine (peraltro bisex). Storie di nozze chimiche tra mago ed eroina, dove s'incontrano alchimia e una fantasia febbricitante, lisergica, riscoperta proprio negli anni acidi del revival magico. Mentre lui, come in ultima fila sulla copertina di Sgt. Pepper's dei Beatles, si diverte a occhieggiare. Franco Pezzini è studioso dei rapporti tra letteratura, cinema e antropologia, con particolare attenzione agli aspetti mitico-religiosi e al fantastico. Tra i fondatori della rivista L'Opera al Rosso, è membro del Coordinamento di Redazione de L'Indice dei libri e della redazione di Carmillaonline.
