EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND AND CERTIFICATIONS

MOST CONSULTING FIRMS LOOK FOR CANDIDATES WITH A STRONG ACADEMIC RECORD, OFTEN FROM TOP UNIVERSITIES. DEGREES

CASE INTERVIEWS AND ASSESSMENTS

But what exactly are organisations, and management consultancy interventions in them? Management consulting is said to be a knowledge-intensive industry. But what kind of knowledge do management consultants possess, and how far can we rely on it? Management consultants are often criticised for unethical exploitation of their clients. But how ought management consultants to behave in order to meet acceptable ethical standards? These are questions about the philosophical topics of ontology, epistemology and ethics. The ancient Greek philosophers thought deeply about these topics, and their ideas remain fresh and relevant even to so modern a subject matter as management consulting. Writing between the end of

the sixth and the end of the fourth century BCE, these philosophers were drawing upon an intellectual tradition that was very different from our own, and were responding to social and economic conditions that were wholly unlike ours.
