Problem: Worker A can complete a job in 8 hours, and Worker B can do the same job in 12 hours. How long will it take them to finish the job working together?

Solution:

- Rate of A = $1/8$ job per hour
- Rate of B = $1/12$ job per hour

$$\text{Combined rate} = 1/8 + 1/12 = (3/24) + (2/24) = 5/24 \text{ job per hour}$$

$$\text{Time to complete job together} = 1 \div (5/24) = 24/5 = 4.8 \text{ hours}$$
