IN CONCLUSION, HIGH SCHOOL HEALTHCARE SCAVENGER HUNT IDEAS REPRESENT A PROMISING INTERSECTION OF EDUCATION, HEALTH AWARENESS, AND INTERACTIVE LEARNING.
