3. MULTIPLY EVERY TERM BY THE LCD

$$8x + 15 = 14$$

4. SOLVE THE RESULTING EQUATION

NOW THAT THE FRACTIONS ARE CLEARED, SOLVE THE EQUATION AS YOU NORMALLY WOULD:

$$8x + 15 = 14$$

SUBTRACT 15 FROM BOTH SIDES:

$$8x = 14 - 15$$

$$8x = -1$$

DIVIDE BOTH SIDES BY 8:

$$x = -\frac{1}{8}$$

5. CHECK YOUR SOLUTION

CONVERT TO COMMON DENOMINATOR 12:

$$\begin{aligned} & \left[-\frac{1}{12} + \frac{15}{12} \right] = \frac{14}{12} \\ & \left[\frac{-1 + 15}{12} \right] = \frac{14}{12} \\ & \frac{14}{12} = \frac{14}{12} \end{aligned}$$

THE EQUALITY HOLDS TRUE, CONFIRMING THE SOLUTION.

ADDITIONAL TIPS FOR SOLVING ALGEBRAIC EQUATIONS WITH FRACTIONS

WORK NEATLY AND KEEP TRACK OF SIGNS
