- **LANGUAGE:** EVALUATES SPEECH FLUENCY AND COMPREHENSION.
- **DYSARTHRIA:** ASSESSES CLARITY OF SPEECH.

- **EXTINCTION AND INATTENTION (NEGLECT):** CHECKS FOR NEGLECT OF ONE SIDE OF THE BODY OR SPACE.

EACH SECTION'S SCORES ARE ADDED TO PROVIDE AN OVERALL STROKE SEVERITY SCORE. UNDERSTANDING THE NUANCES OF THESE ANSWERS HELPS IN MAKING ACCURATE CLINICAL JUDGMENTS.

HOW TO INTERPRET NIH STROKE SCALE TEST ANSWERS

- **21-42:** SEVERE STROKE, HIGH RISK OF MORTALITY AND MAJOR NEUROLOGICAL IMPAIRMENT.

THIS RANGE HELPS HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS PRIORITIZE CARE AND DETERMINE URGENCY FOR TREATMENTS LIKE INTRAVENOUS THROMBOLYSIS OR ENDOVASCULAR PROCEDURES.

COMMON NIH STROKE SCALE TEST ANSWERS AND WHAT THEY INDICATE

FOR EXAMPLE, A PATIENT SCORING 2 ON MOTOR ARM FUNCTION INDICATES MILD WEAKNESS, POSSIBLY REQUIRING PHYSICAL THERAPY BUT NOT NECESSARILY AGGRESSIVE INTERVENTION. TIPS FOR ACCURATE NIH STROKE SCALE TESTING AND ANSWER INTERPRETATION

ENSURE PROPER PATIENT COMMUNICATION

- **SENSORY:** EVALUATES SENSATION TO PINPRICK.
- **BEST LANGUAGE:** ASSESSES SPEECH FLUENCY AND COMPREHENSION.
- **DYSARTHRIA:** TESTS CLARITY OF SPEECH.
- **EXTINCTION AND INATTENTION:** DETECTS NEGLECT OR INATTENTION TO ONE SIDE OF THE BODY.

EACH ITEM IS SCORED INDIVIDUALLY, AND THE SUM OF THESE SCORES FORMS THE OVERALL NIHSS SCORE. FOR INSTANCE, MOTOR FUNCTION IS GRADED FROM 0 (NO DRIFT) TO 4 (NO MOVEMENT), REFLECTING ESCALATING SEVERITY.

INTERPRETING NIH STROKE SCALE TEST ANSWERS

ACCURATELY INTERPRETING THE NIH STROKE SCALE TEST ANSWERS CAN SIGNIFICANTLY INFLUENCE CLINICAL DECISIONS. THE SCORE IS DIRECTLY CORRELATED WITH STROKE SEVERITY:

- **0:** NO STROKE SYMPTOMS.
- **1-4:** MINOR STROKE.
- **5-15:** MODERATE STROKE.
- **16-20:** MODERATE TO SEVERE STROKE.
- **21-42:** SEVERE STROKE.

CLINICIANS USE THESE CATEGORIES TO DETERMINE URGENCY AND POSSIBLE INTERVENTIONS. FOR EXAMPLE, A PATIENT SCORING ABOVE 4 OFTEN QUALIFIES FOR ACUTE TREATMENTS SUCH AS TISSUE PLASMINOGEN ACTIVATOR (TPA). CONVERSELY, A LOW SCORE MIGHT SUGGEST CONSERVATIVE MANAGEMENT OR FURTHER DIAGNOSTIC EVALUATION TO RULE OUT OTHER CAUSES.

THE NIHSS IS ALSO PREDICTIVE: HIGHER SCORES GENERALLY CORRELATE WITH POORER FUNCTIONAL OUTCOMES AND INCREASED MORTALITY. IN STROKE RESEARCH, THE NIHSS SCORE AT ADMISSION SERVES AS A BASELINE TO MONITOR RECOVERY AND EFFICACY OF INTERVENTIONS.

ADVANTAGES AND LIMITATIONS OF NIH STROKE SCALE TEST ANSWERS

WHILE THE NIHSS IS THE MOST WIDELY ADOPTED SCALE, OTHER TOOLS EXIST, EACH WITH UNIQUE FEATURES:

- **GLASGOW COMA SCALE (GCS):** FOCUSES PRIMARILY ON CONSCIOUSNESS LEVEL RATHER THAN DETAILED NEUROLOGICAL DEFICITS.
- **MODIFIED RANKIN SCALE (MRS):** MEASURES DISABILITY AND FUNCTIONAL OUTCOMES POST-STROKE RATHER THAN ACUTE SEVERITY.
- **CANADIAN NEUROLOGICAL SCALE (CNS):** SIMPLER AND QUICKER BUT LESS COMPREHENSIVE THAN NIHSS.

IN COMPARISON, THE NIHSS STRIKES A BALANCE BETWEEN DETAIL AND PRACTICALITY, MAKING IT THE PREFERRED CHOICE IN MOST ACUTE SETTINGS.

IN SUMMARY, NIH STROKE SCALE TEST ANSWERS SERVE AS A CORNERSTONE IN STROKE DIAGNOSIS AND MANAGEMENT. THEIR STANDARDIZED APPROACH FACILITATES TIMELY, INFORMED CLINICAL DECISIONS AND SUPPORTS ONGOING RESEARCH EFFORTS.
