## INDUSTRIALIZATION AND URBAN GROWTH

CITIES EXPANDED RAPIDLY AS PEOPLE MOVED FROM RURAL AREAS AND IMMIGRANTS ARRIVED IN LARGE NUMBERS SEEKING OPPORTUNITY. HOWEVER, THIS GROWTH CAME WITH SIGNIFICANT SOCIAL CHALLENGES, INCLUDING POOR WORKING CONDITIONS, CHILD LABOR, AND ECONOMIC INEQUALITY.

## LABOR MOVEMENTS AND SOCIAL REFORM

IN RESPONSE, LABOR UNIONS LIKE THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF LABOR (AFL) BEGAN TO FORM, ADVOCATING FOR WORKERS' RIGHTS, BETTER WAGES, AND REASONABLE HOURS.
