Malcolm Gets directed the production and it ran for a total of eight performances from September 16th through the 26th in the Black Box Theatre. This document defines the research and process I undertook to arrive at the realization of the role of Zetta to include pre-production research, rehearsals, voice and movement explorations, scene study, and performances. The second part dives further into the context of the play and playwright. Next, I discuss the rehearsal process which includes the technical goals I wanted to incorporate when crafting Zetta. My overall objective was to create a multilayer character rooted in truth and specificity. The technical goals I chose to focus on was using Uta Hagen's pedagogy of substitution from her acclaimed text *Respect for Acting* as well as incorporating script analysis from *A Practical Handbook for the Actor* for acting. For voice I wanted to utilize Kristen Linklater's *Freeing the Natural Voice* to achieve 4 maximum enunciation and articulation. For movement I wanted to infuse Laban Effort Actions for idiosyncratic characteristics and variety, and finally, I wanted to utilize concepts from Fay Simpson's *Book, The Lucid Body: A Guide for the Physical Actor* to incorporate chakra work to create a persona and shadow to give my character interesting yet justified layers. The last part of my Project in Lieu of Thesis focuses on the final rehearsals and performance *Liz Duffy Adams' Dog Act*.

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
