HOUGHTON MIFFLIN HARCOURT EMPHASIZES THEMATIC UNITS WITH HEAVY INTEGRATION OF CIVIC ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES, WHICH MAY BE PREFERABLE FOR SCHOOLS PRIORITIZING ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP CURRICULA. HOWEVER, MCGRAW HILL'S BALANCE OF CONTENT, SKILL DEVELOPMENT, AND TECHNOLOGY INTEGRATION MAKES IT A VERSATILE OPTION FOR DIVERSE EDUCATIONAL SETTINGS.
