- どうも言いますか? (DOU MO IIMASU KA?) (~ NO IKATA WA NAN DESU KA?)
THIS MEANS "WHAT IS THE WAY TO SAY ~?" AND CAN BE USED WHEN ASKING ABOUT PHRASING OR EXPRESSION.

UNDERSTANDING THESE SUBTLE DIFFERENCES HELPS YOU ADAPT YOUR QUESTIONS DEPENDING ON THE SITUATION, WHICH IS IMPORTANT IN JAPANESE CULTURE WHERE POLITENESS LEVELS VARY GREATLY.

COMMON EXPRESSIONS AND USEFUL PHRASES FOR BEGINNERS

- お願いします (ONEGAISHIMASEU) (REQUEST)

IF YOU'RE UNSURE HOW TO SAY ANY OF THESE OR OTHER WORDS IN JAPANESE, YOU CAN SIMPLY SAY:

分からない (Wakaranai) I DON'T KNOW. AND NATIVE SPEAKERS WILL USUALLY BE HAPPY TO HELP. THIS IS ALSO A GREAT WAY TO IMPROVE YOUR LISTENING SKILLS AND PRONUNCIATION.

Using “How Do You Say” to Expand Your Vocabulary

ONE OF THE BEST WAYS TO BUILD YOUR JAPANESE VOCABULARY IS TO CARRY A SMALL NOTEBOOK OR USE A LANGUAGE APP WHERE YOU JOT DOWN NEW WORDS AND PHRASES YOU LEARN. WHENEVER YOU ENCOUNTER A WORD YOU DON'T KNOW HOW TO SAY IN JAPANESE, ASK:

Pronunciation Tips When Asking “How Do You Say” in Japanese
