THIS SCRIPTURE HAS BEEN EXTENSIVELY STUDIED AND REFERENCED BECAUSE IT CHALLENGES BELIEVERS TO REFLECT ON THE AUTHENTICITY OF THEIR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD. THE REPETITION OF “LORD LORD” EMPHASIZES URGENCY AND RECOGNITION, YET THE FOLLOWING DENIAL REVEALS A PAINFUL DISCONNECT. THIS PARADOX INVITES DEEP INTROSPECTION ON WHAT IT TRULY MEANS TO “KNOW” THE LORD BEYOND OUTWARD APPEARANCES.

THE SPIRITUAL SIGNIFICANCE BEHIND THE PHRASE

THIS DISTINCTION OFTEN PROMPTS BELIEVERS TO EVALUATE THEIR SPIRITUAL LIVES MORE CRITICALLY. ARE THEIR ACTIONS CONSISTENT WITH THEIR PROCLAIMED FAITH? DO THEY GENUINELY SEEK TO LIVE ACCORDING TO SPIRITUAL PRINCIPLES, OR ARE THEY MERELY FULFILLING RITUALS?

THE WARNING AGAINST HYPOCRISY

“LORD LORD I NEVER KNEW YOU” ALSO SERVES AS A CAUTION AGAINST HYPOCRISY. IT CHALLENGES INDIVIDUALS WHO MIGHT OUTWARDLY APPEAR DEVOUT BUT HARBOR INTENTIONS OR BEHAVIORS THAT CONTRADICT THEIR FAITH. THIS MESSAGE IS ESPECIALLY RELEVANT IN RELIGIOUS COMMUNITIES WHERE SOCIAL APPEARANCES SOMETIMES OVERSHADOW PERSONAL INTEGRITY.

THE PHRASE ENCOURAGES SELF-EXAMINATION AND HUMILITY, REMINDING US THAT GENUINE CONNECTION WITH THE DIVINE CANNOT BE FAKED OR TAKEN LIGHTLY.

MANY WILL SAY TO ME ON THAT DAY, 'LORD, LORD, DID WE NOT PROPHECY IN YOUR NAME AND IN YOUR NAME DRIVE OUT DEMONS AND PERFORM MANY MIRACLES?' THEN I WILL TELL THEM PLAINLY, 'I NEVER KNEW YOU. AWAY FROM ME, YOU EVILDOERS!'"

He actually saw Archangel Michael and His army of Angels in all out war against a dragon; and the Dragon and his Angels fought back. However, the Dragon and his Angels did not prevail: they were defeated and violently cast out of and down from Heaven: And the huge dragon was cast down and out that ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, he who is the seducer (deceiver) of all Humanity the World over; he was forced out and down to the Earth, and his angels were flung out along with him. Further, the Warriors who vanquished this huge dragon called the Devil and Satan: And they have overcome (conquered) him by means of the blood of the Lamb and by the utterance of their testimony, for they did not love and cling to life even when faced with death [holding their lives cheap till they had to die for their witnessing]. This was a War in which the armaments were the blood of the Lamb and by the utterance of their testimony This was a War of Words! This War would continue on Earth. After the Fall of Man, the War on Earth between the Two Seeds would be a War of the Spirit Beings; fought through Human Beings, and other living things, to the detriment of those who make the wrong choices during the battles to Save the World of Man! How did it begin and how will it end? This is one question every Believer is, literally, dying to know. So did Prophet Daniel (12v8): And I heard, but I did not understand. Then I said: O my lord, what shall be the issue and final end of these things?
