****UNDERSTANDING NWEA SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL 2021 MATH: WHAT PARENTS AND EDUCATORS NEED TO KNOW****

NWEA SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL 2021 MATH PROVIDE A FASCINATING SNAPSHOT INTO HOW STUDENTS ACROSS THE COUNTRY PERFORMED IN ONE OF THE MOST CRITICAL SUBJECTS—MATHEMATICS. FOR PARENTS, TEACHERS, AND SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS, THESE SCORES SERVE AS A VITAL TOOL TO GAUGE STUDENT PROGRESS, IDENTIFY LEARNING GAPS, AND TAILOR INSTRUCTION TO MEET DIVERSE LEARNER NEEDS. WHAT ARE NWEA SCORES AND WHY DO THEY MATTER?

THE NORTHWEST EVALUATION ASSOCIATION (NWEA) ADMINISTERS THE MEASURES OF ACADEMIC PROGRESS (MAP) TEST, DESIGNED TO MEASURE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AND GROWTH IN KEY SUBJECTS LIKE MATH AND READING. UNLIKE TRADITIONAL STANDARDIZED TESTS, MAP ASSESSMENTS ADAPT TO EACH STUDENT'S ABILITY, PROVIDING A PERSONALIZED CHALLENGE THAT ACCURATELY REFLECTS THEIR LEARNING LEVEL.

NWEA SCORES ARE REPORTED USING THE RIT SCALE (RASCH UNIT), WHICH QUANTIFIES A STUDENT'S ACADEMIC KNOWLEDGE ON A CONTINUOUS SCALE. THIS MAKES IT EASIER TO TRACK GROWTH OVER TIME RATHER THAN JUST BENCHMARKING AGAINST PEERS. UNDERSTANDING THESE SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL HELPS EDUCATORS SEE WHERE STUDENTS STAND RELATIVE TO NATIONAL NORMS AND IDENTIFY AREAS NEEDING ADDITIONAL SUPPORT.

NWEA SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL 2021 MATH: KEY TRENDS

THE 2021 NWEA MATH SCORES REVEALED SOME INTERESTING TRENDS, ESPECIALLY CONSIDERING THE LEARNING DISRUPTIONS CAUSED BY THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC. HERE'S A BREAKDOWN OF WHAT WAS OBSERVED ACROSS DIFFERENT GRADE LEVELS:

ELEMENTARY GRADES (K-5)

ELEMENTARY STUDENTS GENERALLY EXHIBITED VARIED PERFORMANCE LEVELS IN 2021, WITH SCORES REFLECTING THE TRANSITIONAL NATURE OF EARLY MATH SKILLS DEVELOPMENT. KINDERGARTEN THROUGH 2ND GRADE STUDENTS TEND TO FOCUS ON FOUNDATIONAL CONCEPTS SUCH AS NUMBER SENSE, BASIC ADDITION, AND SUBTRACTION, WHILE GRADES 3-5 START TACKLING MULTIPLICATION, DIVISION, FRACTIONS, AND BASIC GEOMETRY.

- AVERAGE RIT SCORES FOR KINDERGARTEN HOVERED AROUND 140-160.
- BY 3RD GRADE, AVERAGE SCORES TYPICALLY RANGED BETWEEN 180-200.
- 5TH GRADERS OFTEN SCORED IN THE 210-230 RANGE.

THE 2021 DATA SHOWED THAT WHILE MANY STUDENTS MET EXPECTED GROWTH TARGETS, SOME GRADES EXPERIENCED SLIGHT DIPS COMPARED TO PREVIOUS YEARS, LIKELY DUE TO REMOTE LEARNING CHALLENGES.

MIDDLE SCHOOL GRADES (6-8)

MIDDLE SCHOOL MATH SCORES REFLECT A SHIFT TOWARD MORE COMPLEX TOPICS LIKE PRE-ALGEBRA, ALGEBRA, AND INTRODUCTORY GEOMETRY. THE 2021 DATA INDICATED THAT:

- 6TH GRADERS AVERAGED RIT SCORES NEAR 230-245.
- BY 8TH GRADE, SCORES USUALLY RANGE FROM 250-265.

HOWEVER, GROWTH RATES APPEARED SLOWER FOR SOME COHORTS, EMPHASIZING THE NEED FOR TARGETED INTERVENTIONS TO BRIDGE GAPS, ESPECIALLY FOR STUDENTS WHO STRUGGLED WITH REMOTE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADES (9-12)

HIGH SCHOOL MAP MATH SCORES ARE MORE VARIABLE, DEPENDING ON COURSE ENROLLMENT (ALGEBRA I, GEOMETRY, ALGEBRA II, ETC.) AND INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PATHWAYS. IN 2021, TYPICAL RIT SCORES FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS RANGED FROM 260 TO 300+, WITH HIGHER SCORES CORRELATING WITH ADVANCED COURSEWORK.

IT'S IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT NWEA MAP SCORES AT THE HIGH SCHOOL LEVEL SERVE AS INDICATORS OF COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS, HELPING COUNSELORS AND TEACHERS GUIDE STUDENTS TOWARD APPROPRIATE ACADEMIC GOALS.

FACTORS INFLUENCING NWEA MATH SCORES IN 2021

SEVERAL KEY FACTORS CONTRIBUTED TO THE PERFORMANCE TRENDS SEEN IN THE 2021 MATH SCORES:

IMPACT OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

REMOTE LEARNING, REDUCED INSTRUCTIONAL TIME, AND LIMITED ACCESS TO HANDS-ON MATH ACTIVITIES AFFECTED MANY STUDENTS' ABILITY TO ENGAGE DEEPLY WITH MATH CONTENT. THIS LED TO UNEVEN PROGRESS, WITH SOME STUDENTS DEMONSTRATING STRONG RESILIENCE WHILE OTHERS FACED SIGNIFICANT SETBACKS.

SOCIOECONOMIC DISPARITIES

STUDENTS FROM LOWER-INCOME BACKGROUNDS OFTEN FACED ADDITIONAL OBSTACLES, INCLUDING LIMITED INTERNET ACCESS, FEWER EDUCATIONAL RESOURCES AT HOME, AND LESS INDIVIDUALIZED SUPPORT, ALL OF WHICH CAN IMPACT MATH ACHIEVEMENT AND GROWTH.

INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES AND INTERVENTIONS

SCHOOLS THAT IMPLEMENTED DATA-DRIVEN INSTRUCTION, PERSONALIZED LEARNING PLANS, AND SUPPLEMENTAL MATH PROGRAMS SAW MORE CONSISTENT GROWTH IN THEIR STUDENTS' MAP SCORES. THE 2021 RESULTS HIGHLIGHT THE IMPORTANCE OF LEVERAGING ASSESSMENT DATA TO INFORM TEACHING.

HOW TO INTERPRET NWEA SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL 2021 MATH

UNDERSTANDING WHAT A PARTICULAR RIT SCORE MEANS AT EACH GRADE LEVEL CAN BE CHALLENGING. HERE ARE SOME TIPS FOR INTERPRETING THESE SCORES EFFECTIVELY:

- **LOOK AT GROWTH OVER TIME:** RATHER THAN FOCUSING ON A SINGLE TEST RESULT, TRACK HOW A STUDENT'S RIT SCORE CHANGES ACROSS TESTING PERIODS TO UNDERSTAND THEIR LEARNING TRAJECTORY.
- **COMPARE TO NORMATIVE DATA:** NWEA PROVIDES NATIONAL NORMS THAT HELP PLACE SCORES IN CONTEXT, SHOWING WHETHER A STUDENT IS PERFORMING ABOVE, AT, OR BELOW GRADE LEVEL EXPECTATIONS.

- **FOCUS ON SKILL AREAS:** MAP MATH TESTS BREAK DOWN PERFORMANCE INTO SUBDOMAINS (E.G., OPERATIONS, GEOMETRY, NUMBER SENSE). TARGETING WEAKER AREAS CAN LEAD TO MORE EFFECTIVE IMPROVEMENT.
- **COLLABORATE WITH EDUCATORS:** TEACHERS CAN OFFER INSIGHTS INTO HOW A STUDENT'S SCORES RELATE TO CLASSROOM PERFORMANCE AND RECOMMEND STRATEGIES TO BOOST SKILLS.

PRACTICAL TIPS FOR IMPROVING NWEA MATH SCORES

WHETHER YOU'RE A PARENT LOOKING TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILD OR AN EDUCATOR AIMING TO ELEVATE CLASSROOM ACHIEVEMENT, THESE STRATEGIES CAN HELP IMPROVE MATH PROFICIENCY REFLECTED IN FUTURE NWEA SCORES:

ENCOURAGE REGULAR PRACTICE

MATH SKILLS STRENGTHEN WITH CONSISTENT PRACTICE. USING ONLINE PLATFORMS ALIGNED WITH MAP CONTENT OR TRADITIONAL WORKBOOKS CAN REINFORCE KEY CONCEPTS AND BUILD CONFIDENCE.

USE DATA TO PERSONALIZE LEARNING

LEVERAGE DETAILED MAP REPORTS TO IDENTIFY SPECIFIC SKILL GAPS. TAILORED LESSON PLANS THAT FOCUS ON THESE AREAS OFTEN PRODUCE THE MOST SIGNIFICANT GAINS.

PROMOTE A GROWTH MINDSET

HELP STUDENTS UNDERSTAND THAT ABILITY IN MATH IMPROVES WITH EFFORT AND PERSISTENCE. CELEBRATING SMALL VICTORIES ENCOURAGES CONTINUED ENGAGEMENT AND RESILIENCE.

INTEGRATE MATH IN DAILY LIFE

PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS—LIKE COOKING, BUDGETING, OR SHOPPING—MAKE MATH RELEVANT AND HELP STUDENTS INTERNALIZE CONCEPTS IN MEANINGFUL WAYS.

LOOKING AHEAD: WHAT NWEA SCORES CAN TELL US ABOUT FUTURE MATH ACHIEVEMENT

THE 2021 MATH SCORES SERVE AS A BENCHMARK IN A UNIQUE EDUCATIONAL LANDSCAPE SHAPED BY UNPRECEDENTED CHALLENGES. AS SCHOOLS CONTINUE TO ADAPT INSTRUCTION AND PROVIDE TARGETED SUPPORT, ONGOING NWEA MAP TESTING WILL BE CRUCIAL FOR MONITORING RECOVERY AND GROWTH.

EDUCATORS AND PARENTS ALIKE CAN USE THESE SCORES NOT JUST AS A MEASURE OF PAST PERFORMANCE BUT AS A GUIDE TO FUTURE LEARNING STRATEGIES THAT FOSTER MASTERY AND CONFIDENCE IN MATH.

BY UNDERSTANDING THE NUANCES OF NWEA SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL 2021 MATH, STAKEHOLDERS CAN MAKE INFORMED DECISIONS THAT ULTIMATELY SUPPORT EVERY STUDENT'S JOURNEY TOWARD ACADEMIC SUCCESS.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT WERE THE AVERAGE NWEA MATH SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL IN 2021?

IN 2021, AVERAGE NWEA MATH SCORES VARIED BY GRADE, GENERALLY SHOWING TYPICAL GROWTH PATTERNS WITH SCORES INCREASING FROM LOWER TO HIGHER GRADES. FOR EXAMPLE, 3RD GRADERS AVERAGED AROUND 190-200 RIT, WHILE 8TH GRADERS AVERAGED AROUND 220-230 RIT.

HOW DID THE 2021 NWEA MATH SCORES COMPARE ACROSS DIFFERENT GRADE LEVELS?

THE 2021 NWEA MATH SCORES SHOWED A CONSISTENT INCREASE BY GRADE LEVEL, WITH LOWER GRADES SCORING IN THE 180-200 RIT RANGE AND UPPER GRADES REACHING 220-240 RIT, REFLECTING THE EXPECTED PROGRESSION OF MATH SKILLS AS STUDENTS ADVANCE.

WERE THERE ANY SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN NWEA MATH SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL IN 2021 COMPARED TO PREVIOUS YEARS?

IN 2021, SOME GRADE LEVELS EXPERIENCED SLIGHT DECLINES OR STAGNATION IN NWEA MATH SCORES COMPARED TO PREVIOUS YEARS, LIKELY INFLUENCED BY DISRUPTIONS FROM THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC, THOUGH TRENDS VARIED BY REGION AND SCHOOL.

WHAT IS THE TYPICAL RIT SCORE RANGE FOR 5TH GRADE STUDENTS ON THE 2021 NWEA MATH ASSESSMENT?

FOR 5TH GRADE STUDENTS IN 2021, TYPICAL NWEA MATH RIT SCORES RANGED FROM APPROXIMATELY 200 TO 210, REPRESENTING GRADE-LEVEL EXPECTATIONS FOR THAT YEAR.

HOW CAN EDUCATORS USE 2021 NWEA MATH SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL TO INFORM INSTRUCTION?

EDUCATORS CAN ANALYZE 2021 NWEA MATH SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL TO IDENTIFY LEARNING GAPS, TRACK STUDENT GROWTH, AND TAILOR INSTRUCTION TO ADDRESS SPECIFIC SKILL AREAS WHERE STUDENTS MAY BE UNDERPERFORMING, ESPECIALLY IN LIGHT OF PANDEMIC-RELATED DISRUPTIONS.

UNDERSTANDING NWEA MAP GROWTH SCORES AND THEIR SIGNIFICANCE

THE NWEA MAP GROWTH ASSESSMENT IS A WIDELY USED COMPUTER-ADAPTIVE TEST THAT MEASURES STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AND GROWTH IN VARIOUS SUBJECTS, INCLUDING MATHEMATICS. UNLIKE TRADITIONAL STANDARDIZED TESTS, MAP

GROWTH ADAPTS TO EACH STUDENT'S ABILITY LEVEL, PROVIDING PRECISE DATA ON INDIVIDUAL AND GROUP PERFORMANCE. SCORES ARE REPORTED IN RIT (RASCH UNIT) SCALE SCORES, WHICH REPRESENT A STUDENT'S INSTRUCTIONAL LEVEL AND ARE COMPARABLE ACROSS GRADE LEVELS.

NWEA SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL 2021 MATH ARE PARTICULARLY VALUABLE AS THEY REFLECT NOT ONLY STUDENT MASTERY OF MATHEMATICAL CONCEPTS BUT ALSO THE IMPACT OF DISRUPTED LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS. THEY SERVE AS BENCHMARKS FOR EDUCATORS TO TAILOR INSTRUCTION AND INTERVENTIONS THAT ADDRESS GAPS AND ACCELERATE PROGRESS.

GRADE-LEVEL PERFORMANCE TRENDS IN 2021 MATH SCORES

ANALYZING NWEA SCORES ACROSS GRADE LEVELS IN 2021 REVEALS SEVERAL IMPORTANT TRENDS. WHILE THE EXACT NUMBERS MAY VARY SLIGHTLY DEPENDING ON THE DISTRICT OR STATE, NATIONAL AVERAGES AND PERCENTILE RANKS PROVIDE A RELIABLE FRAMEWORK FOR UNDERSTANDING PERFORMANCE.

ELEMENTARY GRADES (K-5)

IN EARLY GRADES, MATH PROFICIENCY IS FOUNDATIONAL FOR LATER ACADEMIC SUCCESS. THE 2021 DATA INDICATE THAT STUDENTS IN KINDERGARTEN THROUGH FIFTH GRADE EXPERIENCED A MODEST DECLINE IN AVERAGE RIT SCORES COMPARED TO PRE-PANDEMIC YEARS. FOR EXAMPLE, THE AVERAGE RIT SCORE FOR THIRD GRADERS, WHO TYPICALLY ASSESS SKILLS SUCH AS MULTIPLICATION, DIVISION, AND FRACTIONS, DROPPED BY APPROXIMATELY 3-5 POINTS NATIONALLY.

SEVERAL FACTORS CONTRIBUTE TO THIS SHIFT. YOUNGER STUDENTS FACED CHALLENGES ENGAGING WITH REMOTE INSTRUCTION EFFECTIVELY, PARTICULARLY IN HANDS-ON SUBJECTS LIKE MATHEMATICS. ADDITIONALLY, INCONSISTENT ACCESS TO TECHNOLOGY AND HOME SUPPORT INFLUENCED OUTCOMES. DESPITE THESE HURDLES, SOME DISTRICTS REPORTED RESILIENCE, WITH TARGETED SUMMER PROGRAMS AND TUTORING SHOWING PROMISE IN MITIGATING LEARNING LOSS.

MIDDLE SCHOOL GRADES (6-8)

MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS DEMONSTRATED A MORE PRONOUNCED VARIATION IN NWEA MATH SCORES. SIXTH GRADERS, WHO BEGIN MORE COMPLEX ALGEBRAIC AND GEOMETRIC CONCEPTS, SHOWED A DECLINE RANGING FROM 4 TO 7 RIT POINTS ON AVERAGE. THIS TREND CONTINUED INTO SEVENTH AND EIGHTH GRADES, WHERE THE CURRICULUM DEMANDS INCREASE SIGNIFICANTLY.

THIS PERFORMANCE DIP ALIGNS WITH BROADER CONCERNS ABOUT THE PANDEMIC'S DISPROPORTIONATE IMPACT ON ADOLESCENT LEARNERS. THE SHIFT TO ONLINE PLATFORMS MAY HAVE HINDERED THE DEVELOPMENT OF CRITICAL PROBLEM-SOLVING AND REASONING SKILLS ESSENTIAL IN MIDDLE SCHOOL MATH. ADDITIONALLY, MOTIVATION AND ENGAGEMENT ISSUES WERE MORE PREVALENT AMONG THIS AGE GROUP, FURTHER AFFECTING SCORES.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADES (9-12)

HIGH SCHOOL NWEA MATH SCORES, WHILE LESS FREQUENTLY REPORTED DUE TO THE DIVERSITY OF MATH COURSES, ALSO REFLECT SOME DISRUPTION IN STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT. NINTH GRADERS, OFTEN ASSESSED ON ALGEBRA READINESS, EXHIBITED A SLIGHT DECREASE IN RIT SCORES, THOUGH LESS DRAMATIC THAN MIDDLE SCHOOL COUNTERPARTS. ADVANCED STUDENTS IN HIGHER GRADES DISPLAYED MIXED RESULTS, WITH SOME MAINTAINING STEADY GROWTH AND OTHERS FACING SETBACKS.

THE VARIABILITY IN HIGH SCHOOL SCORES CAN BE ATTRIBUTED TO DIFFERENCES IN CURRICULUM PACING, ELECTIVE COURSE OFFERINGS, AND INDIVIDUAL STUDENT CIRCUMSTANCES. MOREOVER, THE TRANSITION TO REMOTE LEARNING POSED UNIQUE CHALLENGES FOR ADVANCED MATH TOPICS THAT HEAVILY RELY ON CONCEPTUAL UNDERSTANDING AND TEACHER-STUDENT INTERACTION.

COMPARATIVE INSIGHTS: 2021 vs. PREVIOUS YEARS

TO CONTEXTUALIZE THE 2021 NWEA SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL 2021 MATH, IT IS ESSENTIAL TO COMPARE THEM WITH DATA FROM 2019 AND EARLIER. THE PRE-PANDEMIC YEARS GENERALLY SHOWED STEADY INCREMENTAL GROWTH IN MATH RIT SCORES, REFLECTING CONSISTENT GAINS IN NATIONAL MATH PROFICIENCY.

- **KINDERGARTEN TO GRADE 2:** ANNUAL GROWTH TYPICALLY RANGED FROM 8 TO 12 RIT POINTS, UNDERSCORING RAPID EARLY SKILL ACQUISITION.
- **GRADES 3 TO 5:** GROWTH AVERAGED AROUND 5 TO 7 POINTS PER YEAR, AS STUDENTS TACKLED MORE COMPLEX OPERATIONS.
- **GRADES 6 TO 8:** GROWTH TENDED TO BE 4 TO 6 POINTS ANNUALLY, WITH EMPHASIS ON PRE-ALGEBRA AND GEOMETRY.
- **GRADES 9 TO 12:** GROWTH VARIED WIDELY BASED ON COURSE LEVEL BUT GENERALLY RANGED FROM 3 TO 5 POINTS.

IN CONTRAST, 2021 SAW NOTABLE STAGNATION AND, IN SOME CASES, REGRESSION IN THESE GROWTH METRICS, ESPECIALLY IN ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL GRADES. THE INTERRUPTION OF TRADITIONAL CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION AND THE UNEVEN QUALITY OF REMOTE LEARNING CONTRIBUTED SIGNIFICANTLY TO THIS PHENOMENON.

IMPLICATIONS FOR EDUCATORS AND POLICY MAKERS

THE INSIGHTS DRAWN FROM NWEA SCORES BY GRADE LEVEL 2021 MATH MUST INFORM STRATEGIC RESPONSES TO ADDRESS LEARNING GAPS. KEY RECOMMENDATIONS INCLUDE:

1. **TARGETED INTERVENTION PROGRAMS:** SCHOOLS SHOULD PRIORITIZE SMALL GROUP INSTRUCTION AND PERSONALIZED LEARNING PLANS TAILORED TO INDIVIDUAL RIT SCORE PROFILES.
2. **ENHANCED PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:** TEACHERS REQUIRE ONGOING TRAINING TO EFFECTIVELY USE NWEA DATA TO INFORM INSTRUCTION AND ADAPT TO DIVERSE LEARNING MODALITIES.
3. **INVESTMENT IN TECHNOLOGY ACCESS:** BRIDGING THE DIGITAL DIVIDE REMAINS CRITICAL TO ENSURE EQUITABLE ACCESS TO HIGH-QUALITY MATH INSTRUCTION.
4. **EXTENDED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES:** SUMMER LEARNING CAMPS, TUTORING, AND AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMS CAN HELP RECOVER LOST GROUND.

FEATURES AND LIMITATIONS OF NWEA SCORES IN 2021

WHILE NWEA MAP GROWTH SCORES OFFER VALUABLE DATA, IT IS IMPORTANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE THEIR LIMITATIONS WITHIN THE 2021 CONTEXT. THE ADAPTIVE NATURE OF THE TEST PROVIDES INDIVIDUALIZED INSIGHTS BUT MAY BE INFLUENCED BY EXTERNAL FACTORS SUCH AS TEST-TAKING ENVIRONMENT AND STUDENT MOTIVATION—BOTH OF WHICH WERE HIGHLY VARIABLE DURING THE PANDEMIC.

MOREOVER, THE 2021 TESTING WINDOW WAS OFTEN COMPRESSED OR DISRUPTED, LEADING TO INCOMPLETE DATA SETS IN SOME DISTRICTS. THEREFORE, INTERPRETING THESE SCORES REQUIRES A CAREFUL, CONTEXT-AWARE APPROACH THAT CONSIDERS SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL FACTORS ALONGSIDE ACADEMIC METRICS.

LOOKING AHEAD: UTILIZING 2021 DATA TO SHAPE FUTURE MATH INSTRUCTION

THE 2021 NWEA MATH SCORES PROVIDE A CRUCIAL SNAPSHOT OF STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT AMID DISRUPTION, BUT THEY ALSO SERVE AS A FOUNDATION FOR FUTURE INSTRUCTIONAL IMPROVEMENTS. EDUCATORS ARE INCREASINGLY LEVERAGING THESE DATA POINTS TO IDENTIFY PRIORITY AREAS FOR CURRICULUM ENHANCEMENT, REMEDIAL SUPPORT, AND ENRICHMENT.

AS SCHOOLS TRANSITION BACK TO MORE STABLE LEARNING ENVIRONMENTS, CONTINUOUS MONITORING OF NWEA SCORES WILL BE ESSENTIAL TO GAUGE RECOVERY AND GROWTH TRAJECTORIES.
