THE STARK VISUALS, MINIMAL DIALOGUE, AND DELIBERATE PACING DISTINGUISH THE FILM AS A WORK OF ART AS MUCH AS A SCIENCE FICTION STORY. THESE ELEMENTS REINFORCE THE NOVEL'S THEMES BY EVOKING A SENSE OF AWE AND MYSTERY SURROUNDING HUMAN EXISTENCE AND THE COSMOS.
