It proposes new approaches to address classical themes – i.e. translation pedagogy, translation norms and equivalence, principles of translation – and brings interdisciplinary perspectives – e.g. contrastive linguistics, cognition and metaphor studies – to cast new light. It is a timely reference for the researchers as well as postgraduate students who are interested in the applications of corpus technology to solving translation and interpreting problems.

Actor/producer/kickboxing champion Don Wilson provides insights from both sides of the camera in his interview. Among the chapters are Albert Dalia's exposition of China's "wandering martial hero" stories that have roots reaching back two thousand years; Christopher Bates' excerpt from Xiang Kairan's *Tales of Chivalrous and Altruistic Heroes*; and Olivia Mok's research and translations of sections of *Fox Volant of the Snowy Mountain*, a Louis Cha's novel of 1959.
