- **TITLE OF SOURCE:** ITALICIZED FOR BOOKS AND WEBSITES; IN QUOTATION MARKS FOR ARTICLES, CHAPTERS, AND SHORTER WORKS.
- **TITLE OF CONTAINER:** THE LARGER WHOLE WHERE THE SOURCE IS FOUND, LIKE A JOURNAL, WEBSITE, OR ANTHOLOGY.
- **OTHER CONTRIBUTORS:** EDITORS, TRANSLATORS, OR ILLUSTRATORS, IF RELEVANT.
- **VERSION:** EDITION OR VERSION NUMBER IF APPLICABLE.
- **NUMBER:** VOLUME AND ISSUE NUMBERS FOR JOURNALS OR MAGAZINES.
- **PUBLISHER:** ORGANIZATION OR COMPANY THAT PUBLISHED THE SOURCE.
- **PUBLICATION DATE:** WHEN THE SOURCE WAS PUBLISHED OR LAST UPDATED.
- **LOCATION:** PAGE NUMBERS FOR PRINT SOURCES OR URL/DOI FOR ONLINE SOURCES.

WORKS CITED ENTRIES

A WORKS CITED ENTRY PROVIDES FULL BIBLIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION FOR EACH SOURCE REFERENCED. THE BASIC FORMAT FOR A BOOK IS:

AUTHOR'S LAST NAME, FIRST NAME. TITLE OF BOOK. PUBLISHER, PUBLICATION YEAR.

FOR EXAMPLE:

SMITH, JOHN. UNDERSTANDING LITERARY THEORY. ACADEMIC PRESS, 2020.

HANDLING VARIOUS SOURCE TYPES

MLA CITATIONS ADAPT TO DIFFERENT MATERIALS:

- ARTICLES FROM ACADEMIC JOURNALS INCLUDE VOLUME AND ISSUE NUMBERS.
- WEBSITES REQUIRE THE URL OR DOI, ALONG WITH THE ACCESS DATE IF CONTENT IS LIKELY TO CHANGE.
- MULTIMEDIA SOURCES LIKE FILMS OR PODCASTS CITE CONTRIBUTORS AND RELEASE INFORMATION.
