THE SECOND SEX BY SIMONE DE BEAUVOIR: A GROUNDBREAKING EXPLORATION OF WOMANHOOD

EXISTENTIALISM AND GENDER

THE MYTH OF FEMININITY AND SOCIAL CONDITIONING

IN ‘THE SECOND SEX,’ SIMONE DE BEAUVOIR DEFINES ‘THE OTHER’ AS THE POSITION ASSIGNED TO WOMEN IN A PATRIARCHAL SOCIETY WHERE MEN ARE CONSIDERED THE DEFAULT OR THE NORM. WOMEN ARE SEEN AS THE SECONDARY OR ‘OTHER’ SEX, WHICH JUSTIFIES THEIR MARGINALIZATION AND SUBORDINATION.

WHAT ROLE DOES EXISTENTIALISM PLAY IN ‘THE SECOND SEX’?

EXISTENTIALISM IS FOUNDATIONAL TO ‘THE SECOND SEX.’ DE BEAUVOIR APPLIES EXISTENTIALIST IDEAS ABOUT FREEDOM, CHOICE, AND RESPONSIBILITY TO ANALYZE WOMEN’S OPPRESSION. SHE EMPHASIZES THAT WOMEN MUST ASSERT THEIR FREEDOM AND TRANSCEND SOCIETAL DEFINITIONS TO ACHIEVE EQUALITY AND SELF-REALIZATION.

How did 'The Second Sex' influence feminist thought and movements?
