Two Jima flags of our fathers: Destructive Sublime Tanine Allison, 2018-06-25 The American popular imagination has long portrayed World War II as the “good war,” fought by the “greatest generation” for the sake of freedom and democracy. Yet, combat films and other war media complicate this conventional view by indulging in explosive displays of spectacular violence. Combat sequences, Tanine Allison argues, construct a counter-narrative of World War II by reminding viewers of the war’s harsh brutality. *Destructive Sublime* traces a new aesthetic history of the World War II combat genre by looking back at it through the lens of contemporary video games like *Call of Duty*. Dick, 2022-05-31 The American World War II film depicted a united America, a mythic America in which the average guy, the girl next door, the 4-F patriot, and the grieving mother were suddenly transformed into heroes and heroines, warriors and goddesses. *The Star-Spangled Screen* examines the historical accuracy—or lack thereof—of films about the Third Reich, the Resistance, and major military campaigns. Concerned primarily with the films of the war years, it also includes discussions of such postwar movies as *Battleground* (1949), *Attack!* (1956), *The Bridge on the River Kwai* (1957), and *Patton* (1970). This revised edition includes new material covering recent films such as *Saving Private Ryan* (1998), *Pearl Harbor* (2001), *Dunkirk* (2017), and *JoJo Rabbit* (2019), and their place in the war movie tradition. *The Star-Spangled Screen* makes a major contribution to popular culture by re-creating an era that, for all its tragedy, was one of the most creative in the history of American film.

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
