THE CULTURAL IMPACT OF THE GREAT GATSBY EXTENDS BEYOND LITERATURE INTO FILM, THEATER, AND POPULAR CULTURE. ADAPTATIONS RANGING FROM THE 1974 ROBERT REDFORD FILM TO BAZ LUHRMANN'S VISUALLY EXTRAVAGANT 2013 VERSION HAVE KEPT THE STORY RELEVANT FOR NEW GENERATIONS. THESE ADAPTATIONS HIGHLIGHT DIFFERENT FACETS OF THE NOVEL, FROM ITS ROMANTIC TRAGEDY TO ITS CRITIQUE OF EXCESS, DEMONSTRATING THE TEXT'S VERSATILITY AND ENDURING APPEAL.

PROS AND CONS OF FITZGERALD'S APPROACH

- **Pros:** FITZGERALD'S CONCISE AND POETIC WRITING STYLE CAPTURES THE ZEITGEIST OF THE 1920S WITH REMARKABLE CLARITY. HIS COMPLEX CHARACTERS EVOKE EMPATHY AND CRITICAL REFLECTION, AND THE NOVEL'S LAYERED SYMBOLISM INVITES MULTIPLE INTERPRETATIONS. THE GREAT GATSBY'S CRITIQUE OF THE AMERICAN DREAM REMAINS RELEVANT, RESONATING WITH CONTEMPORARY DISCUSSIONS ON WEALTH INEQUALITY AND SOCIAL MOBILITY.
- **Cons:** SOME READERS MAY FIND THE NOVEL'S PACING SLOW OR ITS CHARACTERS MORALLY AMBIGUOUS TO THE POINT OF DETACHMENT.
