FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE AS A REFLECTION OF TRAUMA AND LOSS

ONE OF THE MOST POIGNANT WAYS FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE MANIFESTS IN *NIGHT* IS THROUGH THE ARTICULATION OF TRAUMA. THE MEMOIR'S STARK REALISM IS SOFTENED, PARADOXICALLY, BY LITERARY DEVICES THAT CONVEY THE PSYCHOLOGICAL FRAGMENTATION EXPERIENCED BY SURVIVORS. JUXTAPOSITION AND CONTRAST IN FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE

IMPACT OF FIGURATIVE LANGUAGE ON READER ENGAGEMENT AND INTERPRETATION
