ENCOURAGE PARTICIPATION

ASK OPEN-ENDED QUESTIONS THAT INVITE THOUGHTFUL RESPONSES. ENCOURAGE QUIETER MEMBERS GENTLY TO SHARE THEIR THOUGHTS, WHILE GUIDING DOMINANT VOICES TO ALLOW SPACE FOR OTHERS. BALANCE IS KEY.

BE FLEXIBLE AND PATIENT

SOMETIMES DISCUSSIONS VEER OFF-TOPIC OR TAKE UNEXPECTED TURNS. BE READY TO ADAPT WHILE KEEPING THE SESSION PURPOSEFUL. PATIENCE IS ESSENTIAL, ESPECIALLY WITH NEW BELIEVERS OR THOSE WRESTLING WITH DOUBTS.

PRAY FOR GUIDANCE

LEADING A BIBLE STUDY IS A SPIRITUAL RESPONSIBILITY. SEEK GOD'S WISDOM AND GUIDANCE BEFORE AND DURING YOUR SESSIONS. PRAYER NOT ONLY PREPARES YOUR HEART BUT ALSO INVITES THE HOLY SPIRIT TO WORK AMONG YOUR GROUP.

INCORPORATING TECHNOLOGY AND RESOURCES
